Following a period of significant growth and development, Caravan is seeking an experienced and confident **Development Manager** to lead the international network into its next phase. The successful candidate will understand the power of the arts, be highly-motivated, a problem solver, fluent in English and French and brilliant at connecting individuals and organisations from all around the World.

THE ORGANISATION

The international non-profit association CARAVAN was officially founded in October 2008 with 6 European youth and social circus organisations. In 2019, Caravan gathers 35 members from 25 countries. Out of the 35 organisations, 26 are European with other members hailing from all over the world. Together, they share the common objective to promote circus practices in youth education and to encourage the development of the youth and social circus sector through concrete actions such as youth exchanges, training for trainers' programmes and research projects.

All through the years, Caravan has gained knowledge in the field of Youth and Social Circus, not only thanks to its concrete activities but also thanks to the research carried out in the framework of the Erasmus+ programme. Caravan research projects aim to professionalise the sector by creating the first third level education for youth and social circus teachers.

Caravan members work in their local and national contexts and work together on the international level. They use circus arts to invent new possibilities for the social and professional inclusion of people with fewer opportunities. The network supports its members in advocating for the positive benefits of youth and social circus. International advocacy helps the members to gain recognition and support within their own local context and with local authorities.

- **Role purpose** As the most senior member of staff, the Development Manager works with the Board to ensure Caravan is effective in achieving its purpose, vision and mission. The post holder is responsible for ensuring development of the organisation through income generation and diversification as well as providing leadership and effective governance, management and evaluation.

They will also have experience of working in a social/community/education context and

an enthusiasm for circus as a tool for improving outcomes for children, young people and communities.

• Master's degree in International Cooperation, Political Sciences, Social Sciences or related fields.

- Skills/strengths

- Communication:
 - Native English speaker or very high level of fluency in English, with exceptional written English.
 - Fluency in French (any other additional language is an asset).
 - Skilled communicator with an ability to convey complex information clearly to an international audience.
 - Incredible networker and able to develop strong, effective, relationships quickly.
 - Diplomatic and a great judge of character.
 - Able to take others' on the journey, develop their thinking, engagement and involvement.

- Strong commercial and business acumen.
- Numerate and good at managing tight budgets accurately and creatively.
- Strong attention to detail, incredible administrator and motivated by deadlines.

CONDITIONS

This is a <u>one-year contract</u> expected to <u>start on Monday 13th January 2020 (negotiable)</u>. Hours are 28,5 hours per week and can be flexible to suit the employee. The position is based in Ecole de Cirque de Bruxelles. Normally weekend work is not required except during Caravan events. Overtime will be compensated in time off in lieu.
